

*The best decision for post-Army **Fort Monroe**,  
which will be all Virginians' property:*

✓ **Yes: HB3180 (Del. Gear)**  
**No: SB1392 (Sen. Williams)**

**HB3180** gives a broadly representative process to all Virginians

- \* Sensible consideration of all options, including a prosperity-enhancing national park
- \* **Result: Virginians share reuse planning**; accountability to governor and legislature

**But SB1392 in practical effect cedes Virginia's ownership to Hampton**

- \* Emergency basis, for consideration of only a limited range of reuse options
- \* **Result: Hamptonians dominate reuse planning**; accountability only to governor

**The bills call for starkly different planning panels**

Both panels have 5 Kaine administration officials plus Sen. Williams and Del. Gear, **BUT ...**

- \* **HB3180 adds 2 Hamptonians and 12 citizens** appointed by legislators, including one expert apiece from the Civil War Preservation Trust and from historic preservation, regional economic planning, heritage tourism, and conservation and recreation, while
- \* **SB1392 adds 7 Hamptonians—and no one else!**
